

Summer Mystery Shawlette - Part One

Before starting Part One, you will have cast-on the stitches and worked two rows as described in Preliminary Information.

Tip:

To help you keep track of the lace pattern, use stitch markers in one color to mark the edge and center stitches (edge and center stitches are not shown on the charts) and use stitch markers in a second color to mark pattern repeats.

Work Chart A:

Row 1: K3, *pm, work the first 17 stitches of chart, work across the 12-stitch pattern repeat 7 times, work across the remaining 16 stitches of chart, pm,* k1 (center stitch), repeat between * *, k3.

Note that you will decrease 1 stitch at the beginning and end of the chart on every odd-numbered row, so after completing Row 1, you will have on the needle 16 stitches before the first repeat and 15 stitches after the last repeat.

Row 2 (and all even-numbered rows): K3, purl to the last 3 stitches, k3.

Work all 12 rows of Chart A, working the even-numbered rows as Row 2. Note that odd-numbered (right side) rows only are shown on the charts.

At the end of Chart A you will have 217 stitches on the needles (105 stitches in each chart section plus 3 edge stitches at each end plus 1 center stitch).

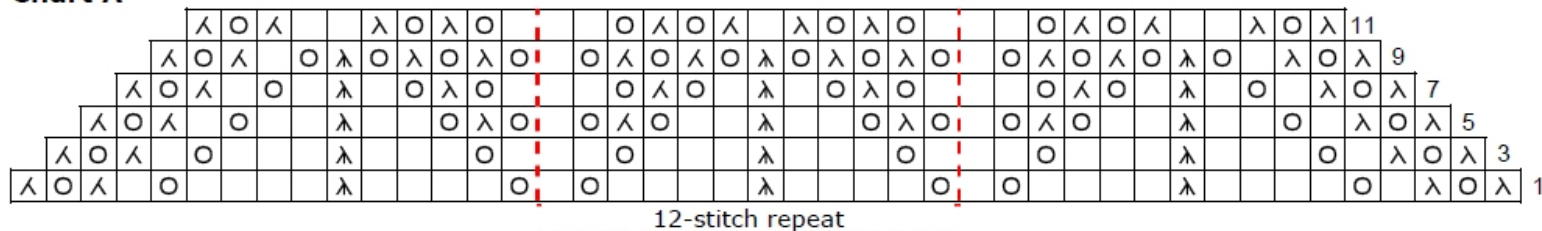


Chart Key

Chart A in Words

Row 1: k3, *ssk, yo, ssk, k1, yo, k4, sl1 k2tog pssso, k4, yo, k1 (yo, k4, sl1 k2tog pssso, k4, yo, k1) 7 times, yo, k4, sl1 k2tog pssso, k4, yo, k1, k2tog, yo, k2tog* k1, work between asterisks again, k3 (237 stitches)

Row 2 and all even-numbered rows: k3, p to last 3 sts, k3

Row 3: k3, *ssk, yo, ssk, k1, yo, k3, sl1 k2tog pssso, k3, yo, k2 (k1, yo, k3, sl1 k2tog pssso, k3, yo, k2) 7 times, k1, yo, k3, sl1 k2tog pssso, k3, yo, k1, k2tog, yo, k2tog* k1, work between asterisks again, k3 (233 stitches)

Row 5: k3, *ssk, yo, ssk, k1, yo, k2, sl1 k2tog pssso, k2, yo, k2tog, yo, k1, (yo, ssk, yo, k2, sl1 k2tog pssso, k2, yo, k2tog, yo, k1) 7 times, yo, ssk, yo, k2, sl1 k2tog pssso, k2, yo, k1, k2tog, yo, k2tog* k1, work between asterisks again, k3 (229 stitches)

Row 7: k3, *ssk, yo, ssk, k1, yo, k1, sl1 k2tog pssso, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, k2, (k1, yo, ssk, yo, k1, sl1 k2tog pssso, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, k2) 7 times, k1, yo, ssk, yo, k1, sl1 k2tog pssso, k1, yo, k1, k2tog, yo, k2tog* k1, work between asterisks again, k3 (225 stitches)

Row 9: k3, *ssk, yo, ssk, k1, yo, sl1 k2tog pssso, yo, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k1, (yo, ssk, yo, ssk, yo, sl1 k2tog pssso, yo, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k1) 7 times, yo, ssk, yo, ssk, yo, sl1 k2tog pssso, yo, k1, k2tog, yo, k2tog* k1, work between asterisks again, k3 (221 stitches)

Row 11: k3, *ssk, yo, ssk, k2, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k2, (k1, yo, ssk, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k2) 7 times, k1, yo, ssk, yo, ssk, k2, k2tog, yo, k2tog* k1, work between asterisks again, k3 (217 stitches)
