

Shetland Pi Shawl KAL – Part Two

You have completed Part One and have 72 stitches on your needle.

Increase Round 4: (K1, yo) around, so that you have doubled the number of your stitches – 144 stitches.

Work 2 rounds, knitting all stitches. While knitting the second round, place a stitch marker after every 9th stitch, if desired, to help you keep your place in the pattern.

Work **Chart B**, repeating the 9 stitches of the chart 16 times over the 144 stitches on your needles. Work Chart B a total of 2 times, for a total of 20 rounds of lace worked.

Chart B Pattern in Words

Round 1: [K3, yo, sl1 k2tog, pss0, yo, k3] repeat these 9 stitches 16 times.

Round 2 and all even-numbered rounds: knit all stitches.

Round 3: [K2, k2 tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k2] repeat these 9 stitches 16 times.

Round 5: [K1, k2 tog, yo, k3, yo, ssk, k1] repeat these 9 stitches 16 times.

Round 7: [K2 tog, yo, k5, yo, ssk] repeat these 9 stitches 16 times.

Round 9: [K2 tog, yo, k5, yo, ssk] repeat these 9 stitches 16 times.

After you finish working 20 rounds of Chart B, work 2 rounds, knitting all stitches. While you knit the second round, remove all your stitch markers except the one that marks the beginning of the round.
